#### **Answers and Solutions**

#### Q:1 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. exorcise.

Exorcise (verb) means to force an evil spirit to leave a person or place by using prayers or magic. Eg: A priest is called upon to Exorcise an evil spirit and bad omen.

# Q:2 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. Your child's hand.

'Hands' will be the wrong use here because hand means both hands.

It is better to use apostrophe than 'of'.

As the chosen option follows the given rules it will be correct.

The correct sentence will be-

I request all of you to hold your child's hand while crossing the road.

#### Q:3 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. on.

In the sentence, we are talking about the time when the government announced the demonetization.

The preposition "On" indicates proximity, time and position above or outside.

Hence, 'on' is the correct choice.

#### Q:4 The correct answer is option 3 i.e. allocate.

Prospect: the possibility or likelihood of some future event occurring.

Devote: the possibility or likelihood of some future event occurring.

Allocate: distribute (resources or duties) for a particular purpose.

Hypothecate: pledge (money) by law to a specific purpose.

In the sentence, we are talking about how nations distribute domestic resources for the control and regulation of corruption and crime. Hence, "allocate" is the correct choice.

Q:5 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. have.

In the sentence, we are talking about selective breeding and modern practices in animal husbandry.

Have is the root VERB and is generally used alongside the PRONOUNS I / You / We / Ye and They and PLURAL NOUNS.

Here we have two plural nouns i.e. selective breeding and modern practices in animal husbandry.

Hence, "have" is the correct choice.

#### Q:6 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. but also.

In the sentence, we are talking about two things. We use "not only.....but also" when we have two things and we want to give a little extra emphasis to the second thing because it's even better, or even worse, or more surprising, or more impressive, or more shocking than the first thing. Hence, "but also" is the correct choice.

#### Q:7 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. although.

We use although to introduce a subordinate clause which contains a statement which makes the main clause of the sentence seem surprising or unexpected.

In this sentence, we are talking about how she was honest and kind in spite of losing everything in the match.

Hence, "although" is the correct choice.

# Q:8 The correct answer is option 3 i.e. No matter what

No matter what is used to emphasize that something is always true, or that someone must do something.

In this sentence, it is said nobody believes her even when she does everything for the betterment of her family and friends.

Hence, "no matter what" is the correct choice.

#### Q:9 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. braver.

The comparative degree is used when you are comparing two items.

In this sentence, we are comparing praveen with other students of the class.

Hence, "braver" is the correct choice.
