Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. CDAB.

The correct formation of this sentence is as follows:

'Indian biotech firm (C)/ Panacea Biotech on Wednesday (D)/ said it is partnering with a US-based Refana (A)/ to make a potential vaccine for Covid-19. (B)/

Hence, option 1 is correct.

Q:2 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. dbca.

The correct formation for this jumbled sentence is as follows:

'The Kosi area is abundant with grass. (d) Its strands are used for making ropes (b)/ that are used for religious functions. (c)/ It is also used in 'sikki art' that is quite famous (a)/

Hence, option 4 is correct.

Q:3 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. abcd.

The part of the sentence that seems to be first is 'a' as it states the want of the person.

This is continued by the part 'b' that mentions the teams whose match they wanted to watch.

So, the correct order of formation is 'We wanted to watch the 1997 grand final between Adelaide and St Kilda on ESPN but the baseball that was on immediately beforehand went into extra innings.'

Hence, option 4 is correct.

Q:4 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. cdab.

The part of the sentence that introduces the subject of 'locusts' is C.

The second part is 'd' as it tells about the other perspective on locusts.

The third part is 'a' as it tells what they become under certain circumstances. This sentence is followed by 'b'.

Hence, option 4 is correct.

Q:5 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. bdac.

The first part of the sentence is 'As a TV host and radio commentator ' and the next part mentions the name of the person i.e. 'Ed Wyatt has reported on AFL in the USA'.

So, the correct order of the sentence is 'As a TV host and radio commentator Ed Wyatt has reported on AFL in the USA, but fans of Australian basketball, baseball and football, in particular, will recognize his West Coast accent.'

Hence, option 2 is correct.

Q:6 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. 4231.
