The meaning of the given word 'atone' means to make amends for.

The theme of the question is to find the word that is the antonym (a word with the opposite meaning) of the highlighted word.

The meaning of the given word 'abstemious' is given to or marked by restraint in the satisfaction of one's appetites.

The word to be representing the antonym is 'Self-Indulgent '.

Hence, the chosen option is correct.

Self-Indulgent: given to or marked by excessive gratification of one's desires.

Self-abnegating: given to or marked by restraint in the satisfaction of one's appetites.

Austere: given to exacting standards of discipline and self-restraint.

Self-controlled: as in disciplined, self-disciplined.

Q:6 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. quittance.

The given sentence requires an appropriate synonym (a word with the same meaning) for the given word.

The meaning of the given word 'obligation' is an act or course of action to which a person is morally or legally bound; a duty or commitment.

The word that fits best as its antonym is 'quittance' as its







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meaning is a release or discharge from a debt or obligation.

The rest of the words are incompatible to be the antonym of the given word.

Hence, option 1 is correct.

Q:7 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. tolerance.

The given sentence requires an appropriate antonym (a word with the opposite meaning) for the given word.

The meaning of the given word 'bigotry' is intolerance towards those who hold different opinions from oneself.

The word that fits best as its antonym is 'tolerance' as its meaning is capacity to endure pain or hardship.

Rest of the words are incompatiable to be the antonym of the given word.

Hence, option 2 is correct.

Q:8 The correct answer is option 3 i.e. ornate.

The given sentence requires an appropriate antonym (a word with the opposite meaning) for the given word.

The meaning of the given word 'unadorned' is not adorned; plain and simple.

The word that seems to be its antonym is 'ornate'.

Hence, option 3 is correct.

Meaning of the words:

modest: unassuming in the estimation of one's abilities or achievements.

malleable: able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking.

ornate: elaborately or highly decorated.

leisurely: acting or done at leisure; unhurried or relaxed.
