Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is Option 4 i.e. Pleasant. Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words:

Pleasant- (of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable.

Grumpy- bad-tempered and irritable.

Cross- annoyed.

Bad Tempered - easily annoyed or made angry. Irritable- having or showing a tendency to be easily annoyed.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word, it will be correct.

Q:2 The correct answer is Option 4 i.e. Rough. Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words:

Rough- not smooth, soft or level.

Exquisite- extremely beautiful and pleasing.

Elaborate - very complicated; done or made very carefully.

Sensitive- showing that you are conscious of and able to understand people's feelings, problems, etc.

Vigilant- careful and looking out for danger. Cautious - taking great care to avoid possible danger or problems.

Rash- acting or tending to act too hastily or without due consideration.

Wary- careful because you are uncertain or afraid of somebody/something.

Garnish - to decorate a dish of food with a small amount of other food.

Amplify - to increase the strength of a sound, using electrical equipment.

Develop - to grow slowly, increase, or change into something else; to make somebody/something do
