Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. Combine.

- Putrefy: decay or rot.
- Destroy: end the existence of (something) by damaging or attacking it.
- Combine: join or merge to form a single unit or substance.
- Contaminate: make (something) impure by exposure to or addition of a poisonous or polluting substance.

Hence, the chosen option, which is giving the opposite meaning to the given word, is correct.

Q:2 The correct answer is option 3 i.e. Doubt. Let's see the meaning behind the given options:

- Hope: a feeling of expectation and desire for a particular thing to happen.
- Chance: a possibility of something happening.
- Courage: the ability to do something that frightens one; bravery.
- Doubt: a feeling of uncertainty or lack of conviction.
- Optimism: hopefulness and confidence about the future or the success of something.

Hence chosen option is correct.

Q:3 The correct answer is **option 1** i.e. **Limited**. Let'se see the meaning behind the given words:

- Widespread: found or distributed over a large area or number of people.
- **Limited**: restricted in size, amount, or extent; few, small, or short.
- General: affecting or concerning all or most people or things; widespread.
- Overall: taking everything into account.
- Famous: known about by many people.

The chosen option is giving opposite meaning to the given word, hence, the correct answer is option 1. **Q:4** The correct answer is **option 1** i.e. **Humble.** Let's see the meaning of the given words:

- Pompous: affectedly grand, solemn, or selfimportant.
- **Humble**: having or showing a modest or low estimate of one's importance.
- Flaunting: to show in a way that attracts attention
- **Boastful**: showing excessive pride and selfsatisfaction in one's achievements, possessions, or abilities.
- Showy: having a striking appearance or style, typically by being excessively bright, colourful, or ostentatious.

Hence, the correct answer is option 1.

Q:5 The correct answer is Option 2 i.e. Loosen.

■ The word 'seize' means 'to take hold of something suddenly and firmly'.

For example: *seized his arm and made him turn to look at me.*

The most appropriate antonym of the given word is 'Loosen' which means 'to become or make something less firmly fixed'.

Let's see the meaning of the other words:

- **Grab**: to take hold of something or someone suddenly and roughly.
- Snatch: to take hold of something suddenly and roughly.
- Catch: to take hold of something, especially something that is moving through the air.

Hence, the correct answer is Option 2 i.e. Loosen.

Q:6 The correct answer is Option 2 i.e. Abrupt.

The word 'Gradual' means 'happening or changing slowly over a long period of time or distance'.

For example: There has been a gradual improvement in our sales figures over the last two years.

■ The most appropriate antonym of the given word is 'Abrupt' which means 'sudden and not expected, often with unpleasant results'.

- Slow: moving, happening, or doing something without much speed.

Hence, the most appropriate antonym elated is depressed.

- Concord: Agreement or harmony between people or groups.
