Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is **option 3** i.e. **Cruel**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options-

Sympathetic- showing that you understand other people's feelings, especially their problems.

Humane- having or showing kindness or understanding, especially to a person or animal that is suffering.

Living- having or showing kindness or understanding, especially to a person or animal that is suffering.

Cruel- causing physical or mental pain or suffering to somebody/something.

Kind- a group whose members all have the same qualities.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be the correct answer.

Q:2 The correct answer is **Option 3** i.e. **Conquer**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options-

Conquer- to take control of a country or city and its people by force, especially in a war.

Forego- to decide not to have or do something that you want.

Forfeit- to lose something or have something taken away from you, usually because you have done something wrong.

Neglect- to give too little or no attention or care to somebody/something.

Capable- having the ability or qualities necessary to do something.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be the correct answer.

Q:3 The correct answer is **option 4** i.e. **Reasonable**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options-

Reasonable- fair, practical and sensible.

Preposterous- silly; ridiculous; not to be taken seriously.

Ridiculous- very silly or unreasonable.

Excessive- too much; too great or extreme.

Incredible- impossible or very difficult to believe.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be the correct answer.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options-

Preserve- to keep something safe or in good condition.

Decimate- to kill large numbers of animals, plants or people in a particular area.

Destroy- to damage something so badly that it can no longer be used or no longer exists.

Execute- to carry out fully.

Abate- to become less strong; to make something less strong.

Dissipate- to slowly become less until it disappears; to make something weaker until it disappears.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be the correct answer.

Q:6 The correct answer is **option 3** i.e. **Mild**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options-

Mild- kind and gentle.

Egregious- outstandingly bad; shocking.

Noticeable- easy to see or notice.

Clumsy- (used about a person) careless and likely to knock into, drop or break things.

Dainty- (used about a person's movements) very careful in a way that tries to show good manners.

Attractive- that pleases or interests you; that you like.

Light- the energy from the sun, a lamp, etc. that allows you to see things.

Rare- not done, seen, happening, etc. very often.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be the correct answer.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options-

Arrogance- showing an offensive attitude of superiority.

Humility- the quality of not thinking that you are better than other people.

Shyness- a feeling of fear or discomfort caused by other people, especially in new situations or among strangers.

Servile- wanting too much to please somebody and so obey them.

Noble- honest; full of courage and care for others.

Gentle- (used about people) kind and calm; touching or treating people or things in a careful way so that they are not hurt.

Kingly- associated with or typical of a king; regal.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be the correct answer.

Q:10 The correct answer is Option 3 i.e. **Criticism**.
Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options-

Criticism- (an expression of) what you think is bad about somebody/something.

Applause- the noise made by a group of people hitting their hands together (clapping) to show their approval and enjoyment.

Cheers- used to express good wishes before you have an alcoholic drink.

Acclaim- to express a very high opinion of something/somebody.

Praise- to say that somebody/something is good and should be admired.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be the correct answer.
