Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. **Oppose**.

Comply- act in accordance with a wish or command.

Defer- to leave something until a later time.

Consent- to agree to something; to allow something to happen.

Adhere- to stick firmly to something.

Oppose- disagree with and attempt to prevent, especially by argument.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:2 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. **order**.

Havoc: It is widespread destruction, confusion, on and lack of order, especially causing damage or trouble.

Order: It is a state in which everything is in its correct or appropriate place.

Sympathy: It is a feeling of pity and sorrow for someone else's misfortune.

Cognition: It is the mental action or process of acquiring knowledge and understanding thought, experience and the senses.

Repress: to subdue someone by force.

The most appropriate antonym for 'havoc' is 'order'.

Q:3 The correct answer is Option 4 i.e. **Serene**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

Clangorous- characterized by or making a continuous loud banging or ringing sound.

Serene- calm and peaceful.

Examine- to consider or study an idea, a subject, etc. very carefully.

Noisy- making noise.

Communicative- willing and able to talk and share ideas, etc.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:4 The correct answer is Option 3 i.e. **Confirm**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

Negate- to stop something from having any effect; to state that something is not true or does not exist.

Confirm- to say or show that something is true or correct, especially by giving evidence.

Invalidate- to show that an idea, a story, an argument, etc. is wrong.

Defer- to leave something until a later time.

Drag- to pull somebody/something along with difficulty.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:5 The correct answer is Option 4 i.e. **Factual**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

Factual- based on or containing things that are true or real.

Illusive- not real and based on illusion.

Mystery- a thing that you cannot understand or explain.

Punish- to make somebody suffer because he/she has done something bad or wrong.

Delusive- giving a false or misleading impression.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:6 The correct answer is Option 1 i.e. **Prejudiced**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

Prejudiced- to influence somebody so that he/she has an unreasonable or unfair opinion about somebody/something; make biased.

Objective- (of a person or their judgement) not influenced by personal feelings or opinions in considering and representing facts.

Detached- (used about a house) not joined to any other house.

Straight- with no bends or curves; going in one direction only.

Fair- appropriate and acceptable in a particular situation.

Q:7 The correct answer is **option 2 i.e. Modest.**

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

Modest- not talking too much about your own abilities, good qualities, etc.

Flamboyant- (used about a person) acting in a loud, confident way that attracts attention.

Glamorous- full of glamour, beauty, and excitement.

Colourful- with bright colours; full of colour.

Sporty- fond of or good at sport.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:8 The correct answer is **option 3 i.e. Decent.**

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

Decent- being of an acceptable standard; satisfactory.

Obscene- offensive or disgusting by accepted standards of morality and decency.

Indecent- not conforming to generally accepted standards of behavior.

Immoral- (used about people or their behavior) considered wrong or not honest by most people.

Offensive- unpleasant; insulting.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Disarming- to take weapons away from somebody.

Detestable- deserving to be hated or criticized.

Charming- very pleasing or attractive.

Convincing- able to make somebody believe something.
