Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is **Option 3 i.e. Reformable**.
Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

- **Reformable**- susceptible to improvement or reform.
- **Incorrigible**- (used about a person or his/her behavior) very bad; too bad to be corrected or improved.
- **Hopeless**- having no expectation of good or success.
- **Incurable**- that cannot be cured or made better.
- **Loser**- a person who is defeated.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:2 The correct answer is **Option 2 i.e. Discord**.
Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

- **Discord**- lack of concord or harmony between persons or things.
- **Consensus**- agreement among a group of people.
- **Accord**- an agreement, especially between countries.
- **Consent**- to agree to something; to allow something to happen.
- **Unity**- the situation in which people are in agreement and working together.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:3 The correct answer is **Option 4 i.e. Truthful**.
Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

- **Truthful**- telling or expressing the truth; honest.
- **Cozen**- trick or deceive.
- **Escape**- break free from confinement or control.

Blaze- a conspicuous display or outburst of something.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

- **Unclear**- not clear or definite; difficult to understand or be sure about.
- **Articulate**- good at expressing your ideas clearly.
- **Enunciate**- to say or pronounce words or part of words clearly.
- **Eloquent**- able to use language and express your opinions well, especially when you speak in public.
- **Coherent**- (ideas, thoughts, etc.) clear and easy to understand; logical.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:5 The correct answer is **Option 2 i.e. Informal**.
Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

- **Informal**- relaxed and friendly or suitable for a relaxed occasion.
- **Prim**- (used about a person) always behaving in a careful or formal way and easily shocked by anything that is rude.
- **Particular**- used to emphasize that you are talking about one person, thing, time, etc. and not about others.
- **Straight**- with no bends or curves; going in one direction only.
- **Nice**- pleasant, enjoyable or attractive.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

- **Derogatory**- expressing a lack of respect for, or a low opinion of something.

 - **Intricate**- having many small parts or details put together in a complicated way.
- As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:7 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. **Recent**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options-

- **Obsolete**: no longer useful because something better has been invented.
- **Recent**: that happened or began only a short time ago.
- **Remote**: far away from where other people live.
- **Outdated**: not useful or common anymore; old-fashioned.
- **Rigid**: not able to or not wanting to change or be changed.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:8 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. **Narrow**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

- **Broad**- including many different people or things.
- **Narrow**- having only a short distance from side to side.
- **Wide**- measuring a lot from one side to the other.
- **Long**- measuring or covering a large amount in distance or time.
- **Large**- greater in size, amount, etc. than usual; big.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:9 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. **Dependence**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

- **Liberty**- liberty is the ability to do as one pleases.

- **Independence**- (used about a person, country, etc.) the state of being free and not controlled by another person, country, etc.
- **Deliverance**- the action of being rescued or set free.

Convenience- the quality of being easy, useful or suitable for somebody.

- **Dependence**- the state of needing somebody/something.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:10 The correct answer is Option 2 i.e. **Stay**.

Let's have a look at the meaning of the given words-

- **Stay**- to continue to be somewhere and not go away; remain in a specified state or position.
- **Digress**- to stop talking or writing about the main subject under discussion and start talking or writing about another less important one; to temporarily wander or stray from your original plan or thought.
- **Stray**- move away aimlessly from a group or from the right course or place.
- **Deviate**- to stray especially from a standard, principle, or topic.
- **Drift**- (of a person or their attention) digress or stray to another subject.

As the chosen option expresses the opposite meaning of the given word it will be correct.
