Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct asnwer is option 2 i.e. Complete transformation.

The idiom 'a sea change' refers to a significant and profound transformation or alteration in circumstances, opinions, attitudes, or situations. Thus, the most appropriate choice would be complete transformation.

The idiom 'Get one's ducks in a row' means to organize or arrange things in a systematic and orderly manner in preparation for a task, event, or situation.

Thus, the most appropriate choice would be have everything properly organized.

The idiom 'child's play' means something that is very easy or simple to do, often to the point where it requires minimal effort or skill.

Thus, the most appropriate choice would be something that is very easy to do.
