Q:1 The correct answer is **option 1** i.e. **Silhouette**.

- **Delineate** is to draw or make apparent the outline of.
- **Silhouette**: to draw or make apparent the outline of.
- **Garble**: to change so much as to create a wrong impression or alter the meaning of.
- **Warp**: to change so much as to create a wrong impression or alter the meaning of.
- **Misdescribe**: as in misspeak, mistranslate.

The most appropriate synonym for **Delineate** is **Silhouette**.
