

Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. Praise. Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

Eulogy- a speech or piece of writing that says good things about somebody/something.

Praise- to say that somebody/something is good and should be admired.

Harmony- a state of agreement or of peaceful existence together.

Euphoria - an extremely strong feeling of happiness.

Homily- a religious discourse that is intended primarily for spiritual edification rather than doctrinal instruction.

As the chosen option expresses the best meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:2 The correct answer is option 1 i.e. Chew. Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

Masticate- to chew food.

Chew- to break up food in your mouth with your teeth before you swallow it.

Choke- to be or to make somebody unable to breathe because something is stopping air from getting into the lungs.

Bite- to cut or attack somebody/something with your teeth.

Swallow- to take through the mouth and oesophagus into the stomach.

As the chosen option expresses the best meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:3 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. Realistic. Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

Pragmatic- dealing with problems in a practical way rather than by following ideas or principles.

Theoretical - based on ideas and principles, not on practical experience.

Realistic - sensible and understanding what it is

possible to achieve in a particular situation.

Perfect- completely good; without faults or weaknesses.

Simple- easy to understand, do or use; not difficult or complicated.

As the chosen option expresses the best meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:4 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. Overstate. Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

Exaggerate- to make something seem larger, better, worse, etc. than it really is.

Bluff- to try to make people believe that something is true when it is not, usually by appearing very confident.

Overstate- to say something in a way that makes it seem more important than it really is.

Explain- the thing or idea that something represents; what somebody is trying to communicate.

Underestimate - to guess that the amount, etc. of something will be less than it really is.

As the chosen option expresses the best meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Q:5 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. Fastidious. Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

Finicky- not easy to please; too worried about what you eat, wear, etc.

Manual - using your hands; operated by hand. **Expression**- something that you say that shows your opinions or feelings.

Tropical - of, relating to, occurring in, or suitable for use in the tropics.

• Fastidious - difficult to please; wanting everything to be perfect.

As the chosen option expresses the best meaning of the given word it will be correct.

Rational- (used about a person) able to use logical thought rather than emotions to make decisions.

Podium - a small platform for a speaker, a performer, etc. to stand on.

Arena- an area with seats around it where public entertainments (sporting events, concerts, etc.)

Tripod- a piece of equipment with three legs that you use for putting a camera, etc. on.

Plentiful- available in large amounts or numbers.

Dais- a raised platform, usually at end of a room for speakers or guests of honour.

As the chosen option expresses the best meaning

of the given word it will be correct.

Q:10 The correct answer is option 3 i.e. Plentiful. Let's have a look at the meaning of the given options:-

Copious - in large amounts.

Vast- extremely big.

Identical- exactly the same as; similar in every detail.

Plentiful- available in large amounts or numbers. **Messy**- that makes somebody/something dirty.
