### Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is **Option 1** i.e. **Blooming**.

- **Blooming**- used to express annoyance or for emphasis.
- **Deathly**- causing or able to cause death.
- **Wasted**- used or expended carelessly or to no purpose.
- **Horrible**- causing or likely to cause horror; shocking.
- **Sick**- affected by physical or mental illness.

Q:2 The correct answer is **option 3** i.e. **peace**.

- **peace**-freedom from disturbance; tranquillity.
- **turbulence**-violent or unsteady movement of air or water, or of some other fluid.
- **agitation**-a state of anxiety or nervous excitement.
- **fight**-take part in a violent struggle involving the exchange of physical blows or the use of weapons.
- **disorder**-a state of confusion.

Q:3 The correct answer is **Option 4** i.e. **Slim**.

- **Slim**- (of a person or their build) gracefully thin; slender.
- **Rotunda**- a round building or room, especially one with a dome.
- **Fat**- a natural oily substance occurring in animal bodies, especially when deposited as a layer under the skin or around certain organs.
- **Dumpy**- (of a person) short and stout.
- **Broad**- tolerant or liberal in one's views and reactions; not easily offended.

Q:4 The correct answer is **option 2** i.e. **infamy**.

- **infamy**-the state of being well known for some bad quality or deed.
- **rectitude**-morally correct behaviour or thinking; righteousness.
- **honesty**-the quality of being honest.

- **goodness**-the quality of being morally good or virtuous.
- **character**-the mental and moral qualities distinctive to an individual.

Q:5 The correct answer is **option 4** i.e. **Reasonable**.

- **Inordinate**- unusually or disproportionately large; excessive.
- **Reasonable**- having sound judgement; fair and sensible.
- **Undue**- unwarranted or inappropriate because excessive or disproportionate.
- **Extreme**-reaching a high or the highest degree; very great.
- **Exorbitant**- (of a price or amount charged) unreasonably high.

Q:6 The correct answer is **option 2** i.e. **Lengthy**.

- **Lengthy**- (especially in reference to time) of considerable or unusual length, especially so as to be tedious.
- **Succinct**- (especially of something written or spoken) briefly and clearly expressed.
- **Curt**- rudely brief.
- **Terse**- sparing in the use of words; abrupt.
- **Pithy**- (of a fruit or plant) containing much pith.

Q:7 The correct answer is **option 3** i.e. **Prevent**.

- **Perpetrate**- carry out or commit (a harmful, illegal, or immoral action).
- **Prevent**- keep (something) from happening.
- **Perform**- carry out, accomplish, or fulfil (an action, task, or function).
- **Execute**- put (a plan, order, or course of action) into effect.
- **Commit**- perpetrate or carry out (a mistake, crime, or immoral act).

- **Chivalrous**: being attentive to women like an ideal knight
- **Cowardly**: lacking courage.
