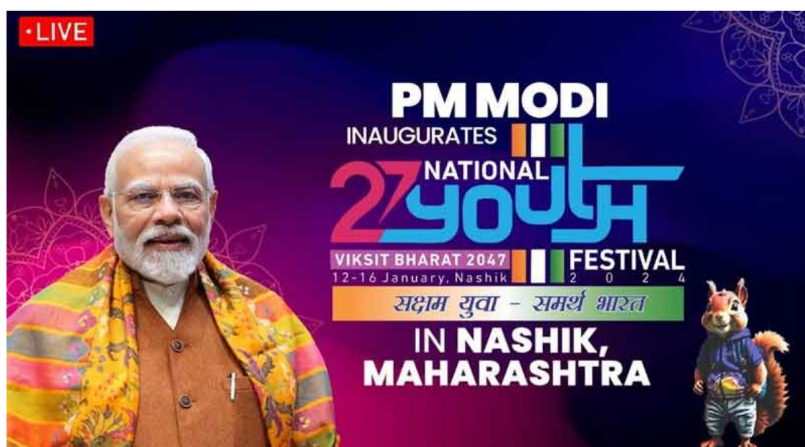
Celebrating Legacy and Inspirations

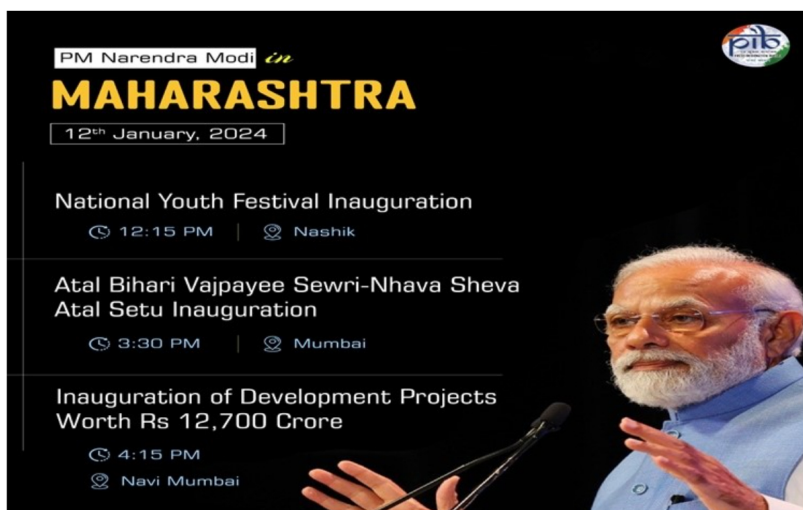
Youth Power as the Catalyst for Progress

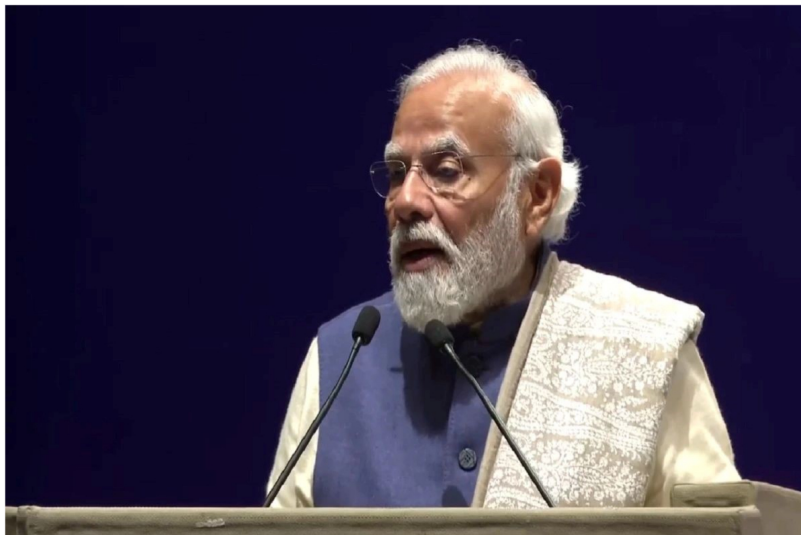
Reviving Traditional Practices and Cultural Identity
