

'Jal Itihas Utsav' – A Celebration and Reflection on India's Water Heritage

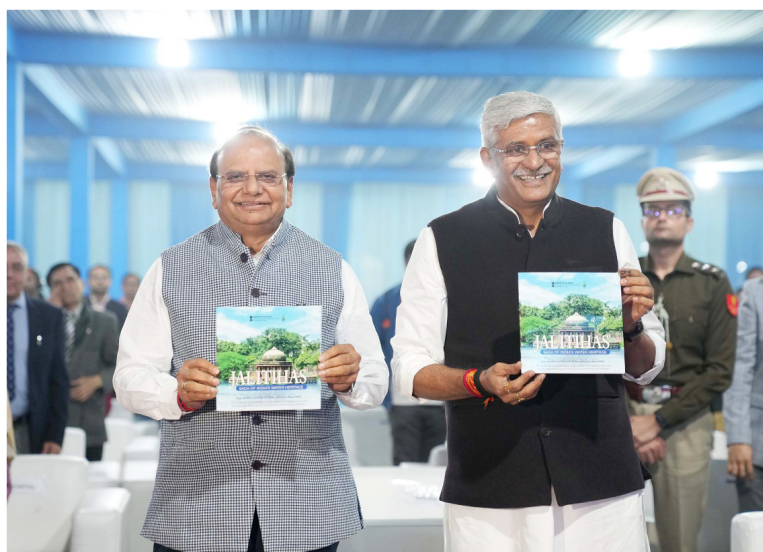
