

Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is **Option** 5 i.e. **No replacement required.**

THe given phrase is contextually as well as grammatically correct. So there is no need for improvement.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option** 5 i.e. No replacement required.

Q:2 The correct answer is Option 1 i.e. entities had also been charging far more.

The passage is in past tense. So, the correct tense which should be used in the emboldened phrase is past perfect continuous tense.

Thus, 'have also been charging' should be replaced with 'had also been charging'.

The correct sentence is: The UIDAI said it have noticed some "unscrupulous entities" who were charging Rs. 50 to Rs. 200 for printing Aadhaar on a plastic card in the name of smart card. Some entities had also been charging far more for simply laminating the downloaded version of Aadhaar, it added.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option 1** i.e. **entities** had also been charging far more.

Q:3 The correct answer is **Option 2** i.e. it had noticed some "unscrupulous entities".

The passage is in past tense. So, the correct tense which should be used in the emboldened phrase is past perfect tense.

Thus, 'have noticed' should be replaced with 'had replaced'.

The correct sentence is: The UIDAI said it have noticed some "unscrupulous entities" who were charging Rs. 50 to Rs. 200 for printing Aadhaar on a plastic card in the name of smart card. Some entities had also been charging far more for simply laminating the downloaded version of Aadhaar, it added.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option 2** i.e. **it** had noticed some "unscrupulous entities".

Q:4 The correct answer is Option 4 i.e. to not allow

their merchants to.

The use of the preposition 'as' is incorrect in the emboldened phrase and should be removed. The preposition 'as' is used to indicate 'while something else is happening; used for comparing people or things'.

The correct sentence is: The UIDAI asked e-commerce firms such as e-bay, Flipkart and Amazon to not allow their merchants to collect Aadhaar information from general public for printing Aadhaar card as this may amount to a criminal offence punishable with imprisonment.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option 4** i.e. **to not allow their merchants to.**

Q:5 The correct answer is Option 2 i.e. with unauthorised agencies for printing or laminating.

In the gieven sentence, '-ing' form of 'print' and 'laminate' should be used.

The correct sentene is: The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has asked public not to share their personal information with unauthorised agencies for printing or laminating their Aadhaar cards.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option 2** i.e. with unauthorised agencies for printing or laminating.
