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

Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct option is option 3 i.e. C.

- Whereas the sentence C on the other hand discusses about the magnitude of an earthquake, which is clearly out of context and hence is a misfit here in the sequence of sentences.

Hence, option C is the correct answer.

Q:2 The correct option is option 2 i.e. B.

■ Except sentence B, all other sentences centre around agesim and its reach whereas the sentence B on the other hand discusses about a research and their insights on granular clusters, which is clearly out of context and hence is a misfit here in the sequence of sentences.

Hence, **option B** is the correct answer.

■ Except sentence D, all other sentences centre around brain health and its functioning. The sentence D on the other hand discusses about donation, a donation that is a global need which is clearly out of context and hence is a misfit here in the sequence of sentences.

- Whereas the sentence A specifies about virus and how it spreads and hence is a misfit here in the sequence of sentences.
