Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is **option 3 i.e. C.**

The error in the sentence is 'have decreased.' It should be '**has** decreased'.

In the sentence, the subject 'number' is singular, so it should be in the singular form of the verb 'has decreased.'

Q:2 The correct answer is **option 1 i.e. C.**

The sentence contains an error in subject-verb agreement.

Explanation: The subject of the sentence, 'data,' is singular, but the verb 'were' is plural.

The correct sentence would be 'The data collected from various sources **was** analyzed to reach a conclusion.'

Q:3 The correct answer is **option 2 i.e. B.**

The sentence contains an error in subject-verb agreement.

Explanation: The subject of the sentence, 'team,' is singular, but the verb 'have' is plural. The correct sentence would be 'The team of experts **has** developed a new strategy to improve the company's performance.'

Q:4 The correct answer is **option 4 i.e. E.**

The sentence accurately describes the investor's favorable opinion of the company's performance. Both 'attractive' and 'trustworthy' are appropriate adjectives to describe the company's performance. There is no error in the sentence.

Q:5 The correct answer is **option 4 i.e. D.**

The subject of the sentence, 'team,' is singular, so the verb 'can work' should be in the singular form. The correct form should be 'could work.'

The verb must agree with the subject in number (i.e., singular or plural). A singular subject takes a singular verb, and a plural subject takes a plural verb. When the subject is singular, it is important to use the singular form of the verb.

So, the sentence should read as 'The team was

divided into smaller groups so that it **could** work more efficiently.' This makes the sentence grammatically correct and eliminates the error of verb-subject agreement.
