Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is option 2 i.e. Only 2.

There are 24 standing parliamentary committees concerned with several departments. Each committee has 31 members, of which 10 are chosen by the Chairman of the Rajya Sabha and 21 are chosen by the Speaker of the Lok Sabha from among its members. Each member has a one-year term in office.

PM - KUSUM (**Pradhan Mantri Kisan Urja Suraksha evam Utthan Mahabhiyan**) Scheme launched by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy in 2019.
