

- 1. The Pradhan Mantri Virasat Ka Samvardhan (PM VIKAS) scheme is aimed at improving the skills of artisans, ensuring easy credit, and also helping them in brand promotion so that their products reach the market quickly. The scheme comes under the Ministry of Minority Affairs.
- 2. Under the PM SHRI scheme, there is the provision for setting up of More than 14500 PM SHRI Schools (PM Schools for Rising India) by strengthening the existing schools from amongst schools managed by the Central Government/State/UT Government/local bodies. The scheme comes under the Ministry of Education.
- 3. PM MITRA stands for PM Mega Integrated Textile Regions and Apparel. The purpose of establishing PM MITRA Parks is to boost the Indian textile industry. The Ministry of Textiles will oversee the execution of these projects.
- 4. The Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) is an initiative of the Government of India that aims at providing affordable housing to the urban poor. The scheme comes under the Ministry of Rural Development.
