Answers and Solutions

Q:1 The correct answer is option 4 i.e. All are true. The Balwant Rai Mehta Committee was a committee originally appointed by the Government of India on 16 January 1957. The committee submitted its report on 24 November 1957 and recommended the establishment of the scheme of 'democratic decentralisation' which finally came to be known as Panchayati Raj. The main aim of the Panchayat Raj system is to settle the local problems locally and to make the people politically conscious.

The recommendation of the Balwant Rai Mehta committee are:

- 1. Gramme Panchayat, Panchayat Samiti, and Zila Parishad, the local governing bodies, had to take over the administration.
- 2. Irrespective of political parties, Elections have to be constituted every 5 years in a genuine way.

- 1. The member of the phylum Echinodermata, a group of marine invertebrate organisms distinguished by their tube feet, calcite body coverings (test), and five symmetrical body parts. Starfish, Crinoids, Blastoid, Sea urchins are examples of Exhinodermata.
- 2. Mollusca is the second-largest phylum of invertebrate animals, after the Arthropoda. **Examples of Mollusca Examples** are Heliotis, scallops, oysters, periwinkles, whelks, squid, clams, snails, and octopuses.
- 3. The phylum Porifera comprises the sponges. it is a group of simple aquatic animals that lack true tissues and organs. Sycon, Spongilla, Euspongia, and Hyalonema are examples of phylum Porifera.
- 4. Chordata consists of animals with flexible rod supporting their dorsal or back sides. A chordate is an animal belonging to the phylum Chordata. Examples of Chordata are mammals, fish, birds(Crows), reptiles, and amphibians.
